## County and Age Group Championships 2025

(Under Swim England Laws and Technical Rules)

### Meet Conditions and Entry Procedure

#### Introduction

1. The County Championships, the County Age Group Championships and the County Para-Swimming Championships are run as an integrated meet. They are governed by the County Championships Conditions approved by the County Management Board which can be found on the BSBASA website ([bsbasa.org](http://bsbasa.org)). The key requirements of the County Championship Conditions are summarised in this document.
2. The Championships will be held at Wycombe Leisure Centre. The pool has 8 lanes and features anti-turbulence lane ropes, electronic timing (AOE) and backstroke ledges. All events will be swum long-course (50m). The adjacent 20m community pool will be available to swimmers for warm up during racing and for swim down (access restrictions may be imposed during warm up).
3. The facilities at Wycombe feature a mixed gender wet side changing village. Only swimmers and authorized personnel may access the pool and changing areas during the meet.
4. Spectators are only permitted access to the public areas of the leisure centre and the spectators gallery. Access poolside, to the sports hall and marshalling areas will be restricted to swimmers, coaches and team managers (or official chaperones) with poolside passes.
5. The meet will be run under the Swim England Laws, Regulations and Technical Rules, the relevant World Para Swimming Rules and these Promoter's Conditions.
6. The meet is licensed at Level 1 by Swim England and has been allocated the following licence numbers:

7. Any matter not covered by these conditions shall be determined by the BSBASA Performance Swimming Events Committee, and in the case of matters requiring a decision during the meet by the chairman of that committee and as many of its members who are available.

#### Photography and Video Recordings

8. Use of Video and still cameras is permitted at the event, in line with Swim England guidance. Any photos and videos taken may only be for personal use and may not be broadcast or published (including web-streaming) without the prior written consent of the Promoter.
9. By entering these championships, swimmers accept that their image may be captured and used as described above, Swimmers and parents who do not wish their images to be used should contact the promoter in advance of the event and prior to entry.
10. No cameras, including those on mobile phones and other devices, are permitted to be used or to be visible in the changing village. If any participant is seen to be holding or using any such device in the changing area, they will be immediately removed from the remainder of the Championships and no refunds given. Furthermore, the incident will be reported to Swim England and/or their club for further action in line with Swim England's safeguarding policy.

## **Eligibility**

11. Only swimmers who are registered with Swim England as members of clubs affiliated to the County Association on the closing date for entries and have Swim England “Club Compete” membership may enter.
12. A competitor may only represent one club in the Championships. A competitor who has entered BSBASA Championships in any other discipline held in the same calendar year can only swim in the name of the same club represented in that Championship. Furthermore, a competitor who has swum in the Championship or Age Group Competitions of another county held in the same calendar year may not enter or swim in these Championships.
13. A swimmer must also be registered with Swim England as a member of a club affiliated to the Association and have Swim England “Club Compete” membership during the period of the competition. Where this is a different club than the entry club (i.e. where a swimmer has changed their registered club after entering), the swimmer will represent their new club, except if they have already swum in the name of their old club at these Championships or a BSBASA Championships in any other discipline in the same calendar year. In such cases, the swimmer will be allowed to swim but will not represent any club from the point of re-registration.
14. All clubs affiliated to the County Association may enter team events. Individual competitors selected to represent their club must be eligible to enter individual events in the name of that club, and swimmers can only swim in the teams of one club at these Championships.
15. A swimmer may not compete for more than one team in the same event.

## **Para Swimmers**

16. Classified Para Swimmers may enter any event provided they meet the eligibility requirements above. The normal consideration times can also be extended to take into consideration the swimmer’s classification category and the equivalent national para-swimming qualification times. Extensions will be subject to the promoter’s discretion.
17. Clubs with para swimmers wishing to take advantage of extended consideration times should contact the Entries Secretary ([championships@bsbasa.org](mailto:championships@bsbasa.org)) before submitting their entries. The entries secretary will be responsible for assessing the application and the decision of the Entries Secretary will be final.
18. A secondary strobe light for S15 swimmers is available. Clubs with swimmers wishing to use the secondary strobe light should request this from the organisers when submitting their entries.
19. All Para-Swimmers must have an authorised IPC Swimming, British Swimming, INAS-FID or British Blind Sport classification, which is held on the British Swimming or IPC Swimming classification database at the time of entry. S15 swimmers must be registered as a member of GB Deaf Swimming.
20. The Para-Swimming multi-classification competition awards are described later in this document.

## Individual Events

21. Events are separated into the following age groups:

10-11 years, 12 years, 13 years, 14 years, 15 years, 16 years, and 17 years & over.  
(N.B: Age groups will swim together during events, except in finals)

22. The following individual events are included in these Championships:

Freestyle	50m, 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m, 1500m
Backstroke	50m, 100m, 200m
Butterfly	50m, 100m, 200m
Breaststroke	50m, 100m, 200m
Individual Medley	200m, 400m

10 and 11 year olds may not enter the 800 or 1500m Freestyle, or the 400m IM.

23. Finals will be held for 50m and 100m events.

24. There shall be separate events for “Open/Male” and “Female” categories. The “Female” category is for birth sex females in accordance with Swim England’s Transgender and Non-Binary Competition Policy. By entering the “Female” category, a swimmer confirms that their birth sex is female

25. Ages are determined by the swimmer’s age on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2025. Swimmers younger than 10 years old on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2025 may not enter the Championships.

## Team Events

26. The following team events are included in these Championships:

27. The Tandem Relay is intended to be a fun event to finish each weekend. If the meet is over capacity for the pool time available, the event will be cancelled in lieu of withdrawing swimmers from individual events.

28. The rules for the Tandem Relay are as follows:

- Teams must comprise of 6 swimmers. The combined age of the team when added together must be no more than 87 years old.
- The team must nominate a swimming order on the team declaration form.
- A club may enter more than one team (see para 49 below).
- The race is swum over 6 lengths, 300m. All legs are freestyle.
- All 6 swimmers start in the pool in their allocated lane, and take up their starting positions as follows. Swimmers 1 and 2 on the wall, swimmers 3 – 6 lined up along the lane rope towards the backstroke flags.

- On the starting signal, swimmer 1 (as nominated on the team declaration form) pushes off the wall, followed by swimmer 2. Swimmer 3 swims to the wall and pushes off and so on (all swimmers must touch the wall to start).
- The six swimmers then swim in procession in a clockwise direction. There is no overtaking within the lane at any point in the race, however a swimmer may draw alongside the swimmer in front without passing them provided it is safe to do so.
- After swimmer 1 completes 50m, they drop out and the procession is lead by swimmer 2.
- After swimmer 2 completes 100m, they drop out and the procession is lead by swimmer 3, and so on.
- The final leg is swimmer 6 swimming alone, and the race finishes when swimmer 6 completes their solo 50m and 300m for the team.
- Swimmers who have dropped out should leave the pool by the side as soon as it is safe to do. The usual relay rules on impeding swimmers from other teams apply.

### **Entry Procedure - General**

29. All entries must be made via your swimming club. Clubs may set out their own entry procedures.
30. Club entries must be made in electronic format using either “SportSystems Entry Manger” or “TeamUnify” software. The entry files will be issued to the nominated club representative by email together with additional information on the entry process and payment instructions.
31. Clubs must nominate the person responsible for submitting their entry by the 20<sup>th</sup> October 2024. Nominations and entry files should be submitted by email to [championships@bsbasa.org](mailto:championships@bsbasa.org)
32. **The closing date for submitting entries is 23:59 on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> December 2024 (note that clubs may impose an earlier closing date).** No entries will be accepted after the closing date. Clubs are encouraged to submit provisional entries before the closing date to test the process. Provisional entries can be replaced by final entries up until the closing date. Once the closing date has passed, entry times cannot be changed.
33. Entry fees for individual events are £8.50 per event of 200m or less, £10.50 per event for the 400m events, £13.50 for the 800m Freestyle and £16.50 for the 1500m Freestyle. Entry fees for the team events are £15 per event.
34. No entries will be accepted without payment of the appropriate entry fee. Except where it is not possible to accept entries (see below) entry fees are not refundable whatever the circumstances. Entry fees in respect of an incorrect entry will be forfeited.

### **Poolside Passes**

35. Poolside passes cost £20 each which covers all 4 days of the championships. Passes are required for each coach and team manager. Where different club members are attending different sessions, passes may be transferred to other users.
36. Poolside passes may only be used by Coaches, Team Managers and Chaperones who meet the standard for Swim England poolside accreditation. They must be nominated by their club and be confirmed as having valid Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checks, Safeguarding Certification and meet the minimum qualification requirements for their role.
37. Please refer to the [Swim England Policy on Team Manager, coach and Chaperones](#) for more information on minimum supervision ratios and qualifications.
38. Additional poolside passes may be purchased after the closing date if necessary.

## **Entry Procedure for Individual events**

39. Swimmers must have achieved the consideration time since 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023. These times must have been achieved at Swim England licensed meets (Levels 1 – 4) and be included in the [Swim England Rankings Database](#) at the date of entering.
40. Valid times must be short course (from a 25m pool) or converted long course times (from a 50m pool). Conversion of 50m times will be done using the Swim England official algorithm within the entry manager software.
41. Please check your membership information in the Swim England database is correct and aligned with your club membership system before entering and update in advance as necessary (<https://www.swimmingresults.org/membershipcheck>). Errors may mean we are unable to upload your times to rankings.
42. Split times from longer events will not be accepted for entry. Relay lead off times will only be accepted where these are attributed to the relevant swimmer for the individual stroke/distance in the Swim England Rankings Database.
43. The promoter will carry out checks that the times entered match those on Rankings. Swimmers entering incorrect times may have their entire entry cancelled. In such circumstances, the promoter reserves the right not to refund entry fees.
44. Please note that meeting the consideration time does not guarantee entry. Depending on the volume of entries it may not be possible to accept all entries from swimmers who have achieved the consideration time. Where it is not possible to accept all entries, swimmers with the fastest times will be accepted, taking into account the need to be fair between age groups. In order to keep within the allowed session times, the long-distance events (400m, 800m & 1500m) are the most likely to be restricted.
45. Where possible, swimmers who are not accepted will be wait-listed and able to swim in the event of withdrawals, although this remains at the sole discretion of the promoter.
46. The consideration times included in this document are short-course times, converted long-course times may be used. The consideration times are stated to tenths of a second. For the avoidance of doubt, where the consideration time is stated as (say) 1:37.0, a time of 1:37.00 meets the entry criterion, whereas 1:37.01 does not.

## **Entry Procedure for Team events**

47. There are no consideration times for team events, and it is intended that the County team events should be a good opportunity for swimmers to gain experience of relay team racing. It is therefore expected that there will be a wide range of entry times in each event.
48. Estimated entry times should be provided for each relay team entry. Clubs and coaches should ensure that the entry times are appropriate for the team that is expected to swim on the day and think twice about entering teams that are likely to be significantly below the standard of the other competing clubs.
49. It may be necessary to restrict the number of relay teams, in which case 2<sup>nd</sup> and subsequent teams from a club will be selected by lottery to fill the available spaces.
50. It is not necessary to name the swimmers from whom each team will be selected on the entry form.

## Notification of Accepted Swims

51. Accepted swims will be posted at [bsbasa.org](http://bsbasa.org) as soon as possible after the closing date. It is the responsibility of swimmers and clubs to check entry details carefully before the meet starts. Any processing errors notified before the start of the meet will be corrected. It is most unlikely that errors can be corrected once the meet has started. We are unable to correct any errors from club entry files.

### Meet details

52. The order of events is provided on pages 10 and 11. Session start times are currently provisional and will be confirmed once the entries have been processed. Swimmers should consider carefully which events they enter, and in particular the possibility that if they qualify for finals, they may need to swim a number of races over a short period of time. It will not be possible to have additional breaks in the programme to accommodate multiple swims.

53. Swimmers who qualify for finals are expected to swim in those finals, and withdrawals from finals should only occur in exceptional circumstances. Finalists' names will be called out in turn by the announcer before the start of each final.

54. Swimmers whose entries have been accepted, but who do not intend to swim must withdraw. Withdrawals must be notified to your team manager, who will in turn notify the meet organisers (before the start of the warm-up for each session). Clubs with an unacceptable level of unreported withdrawals will be reported to the Performance Swimming Events Committee who may impose a penalty, including a fine.

**55. Swimmers accepted for the long distance events (400m or greater) but who do not intend to swim are requested to notify their withdrawal to the organisers as soon as possible before the race day so that reserve swimmers can take their place.**

56. Withdrawals can be made at any time by email to [championships@bsbasa.org](mailto:championships@bsbasa.org).

57. The list of finalists for events with finals will be published as soon as possible after the heats have been completed. This list of finalists will also contain a "withdraw by time". Finalists (including reserves) who wish to withdraw (which should be in exceptional circumstances only) must notify their club's designated team manager, who will in turn notify the meet organisers before the relevant "withdraw by" time.

58. A fine of £10 may be levied on clubs in respect of each finalist (including reserves) who do not compete without having complied with the withdrawal process above. The entry process for future BSBASA performance swimming competitions will be blocked for clubs which have unpaid fines.

59. Team declaration forms for relay events will be emailed to the designated club contact before the start of the meet. These forms must be printed and completed with the details of the swimmers who will actually compete and must be posted on the day of the event prior to the time stated on the form. If forms are not posted, then swimmers and teams will not be able to swim. It is not necessary to withdraw from these events. No changes to the declared teams can be made after the declaration time shown in the form. Teams who do not swim the declared swimmers in the declared order will be disqualified.

60. All events will be seeded slow to fast. For events with finals, the fastest 3 heats will be cyclically seeded, all other heats will be spearhead seeded. For events without finals, all heats will be spearheaded.

61. During the championships swimmers will be marshalled in the sports hall. Space poolside is limited and swimmers are encouraged to use the sports hall for warming up and when waiting to swim. Coaches and TMs poolside must ensure there is adequate space around them for the officials and to provide safe access. Should the poolside area become overly congested, the promoter may require coaches and TMs to remove some of their swimmers from poolside.
62. Swimmers should leave the poolside area via the changing rooms. Swimmers will not be permitted to return to the sport hall directly from poolside.
63. The changing room and swimmer marshalling areas will be patrolled regularly to provide security for those attending the championships. Only swimmers and adults with legitimate reasons relating to the championships are allowed in these areas. All other persons present will be asked to leave.

## **Awards**

64. Age Group and Para-swimming Multi-Classification medals should be collected from the medal desk. Trophies, County Championship medals and Team event medals will be handed out poolside during the awards ceremonies held at the end of each session.

### Age group awards and finals

65. Age Group Medals will be awarded for first, second and third place.
66. Awards will be made to the winners in each age group.
67. Age group awards for events of 200m and over will be made on a heat declared winner basis.
68. Age group awards for the 50m and 100m events will be made based on the finish position in the relevant age group final. The fastest 8 swimmers from the heats in each age group will qualify for the relevant age group final. Two reserves will be also nominated, who will be promoted into the final in the event of a faster swimmer withdrawing. There will be no swim-offs for equal placed swimmers and in such cases the number of reserves and the number of swimmers in the final shall be reduced as necessary.
69. For the avoidance of doubt, swimmers must swim in the heats even if there are 8 or fewer swimmers in their age group. Furthermore, swimmers who are disqualified or do not finish in the heats will not qualify for the finals.

### Para-Swimming multi-classification competition awards

70. The 50m and 100m events will include Para-Swimming multi-classification awards.
71. Classified para-swimmers (Categories 1 – 14) will, in addition to their age group placing, be placed in a multi-classification award category. Placing will be done using the British Para Swimming Points (BPSP) system based on the times achieved in the heats only.
72. Category 64 swimmers will be treated as Category 14 swimmers.
73. Category 99 swimmers (those awaiting classification) and Category 15 swimmers may benefit from consideration times extension (see paragraph 9 above) but are not eligible for the Para-Swimming multi-classification awards. This because, it is not possible to compute BPSP for Category 15 and 99 swimmers.

### Senior County Championship

74. The Senior County Championship is for swimmers who are 15 years & over on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2025.
75. For events of 200m and over, the Senior County Championship will be decided based on the heat results. The Senior County Championship Trophy and a County Championship Gold Medal will be awarded to the Senior swimmer achieving the fastest time in the heats. A silver medal will be awarded for second place, and a bronze medal will be awarded for third place.
76. For the 50m and 100m events, there will be virtual Senior County Championship finals. The times of the swimmers in the 15 years, 16 years, and 17 years & over finals will be taken into a virtual final and the Senior County Championship Trophy and a County Championship Gold Medal will be awarded to the swimmer with the fastest time. A silver medal will be awarded for second place, and a bronze medal will be awarded for third place.

#### Junior County Championship

77. The Junior County Championship is for swimmers who are 14 years & under on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2025.
78. For events of 200m and over the Junior County Championship will be decided on heat times. The Junior County Championship Trophy and a County Championship Gold Medal will be awarded to the Junior swimmer achieving the fastest time in the heats. A silver medal will be awarded for second place, and a bronze medal will be awarded for third place.
79. For the 50m and 100m events, there will be virtual Junior County Championship finals. The times of the swimmers in the 10-11 years, 12 years, 13 years and 14 years finals will be taken into a virtual final and the Junior County Championship Trophy and a County Championship Gold Medal will be awarded to the swimmer with the fastest time. A silver medal will be awarded for second place, and a bronze medal will be awarded for third place.

#### Team event awards

80. The winners of all team events will be determined on a heat declared winner basis.
81. The team winning the Open age group event will be awarded The Senior County Championship Trophy and each swimmer will receive a County Championship Gold Medal. The teams placed second and third will also each receive a County Championship Medal.
82. The team winning the 12-13 event will be awarded The Junior Championship Trophy and each swimmer will receive a County Championship Gold Medal. The teams placed second and third will also each receive a County Championship Medal.
83. For the 16 yrs & under and the 10-11 yrs team events, Age Group Gold Medals will be awarded to each swimmer in the team placed first. The teams placed second and third will also each receive an Age Group Medal.
84. Age Group Medals will be awarded to the top 3 placed teams in the Tandem relay events.

#### Aggregate awards

85. Points will be awarded to the first eight competitors in each age group of each event, including the team events, as follows:

Winner: 15 points; 2<sup>nd</sup> place: 10 points; 3<sup>rd</sup> place: 7 points; 4<sup>th</sup> place: 5 points; 5<sup>th</sup> place: 4 points; 6<sup>th</sup> place: 3 points; 7<sup>th</sup> place: 2 points; 8<sup>th</sup> place: 1 point. Where there is a dead heat, the points



are shared.

86. For events with finals, points will be awarded based on the placing in the final.
87. No points are awarded for placings in the Senior and Junior County Championships.
88. No points will be awarded to the Tandem Relay Event.
89. The Parker Silver Cup and the Lambert Shield will be awarded to the Female and Open/Male swimmer respectively who achieve the highest aggregate points score. In the event of a dead heat on aggregate points, the swimmer with the greatest number of first places shall be declared the winner, and if this also produces a dead heat, the swimmers concerned shall be declared joint winners.
90. Points awarded to competitors will also be accrued by the Club that the swimmer is representing. No two clubs can make use of the same competitor for the purpose of counting points in these competitions in any one year (as explained in the Eligibility section above).
91. The total number of points obtained by each Club shall be added together on completion of the Championships and the Club obtaining the highest aggregate score shall be declared the winner. In the event of a dead heat on aggregate points, the club with the greatest number of first places shall be declared the winner, and if this also produces a dead heat, the Clubs concerned shall be declared joint winners.

### **Trophies**

92. Trophies awarded annually may be kept by the winners until the following year's championships, subject to completing the necessary documentation as regards its safekeeping and return. Any holder of a trophy who fails to return that trophy by the specified date shall not be allowed to take custody of any trophies which he or she might be awarded during the County Championships in that calendar year.

### **Use of data**

93. Refer to <https://bsbasa.org/WebEntry/dataPolicy.html> for details of how we use and store your data. This information (together with the meet results) may be used
  - to contact clubs regarding entries and the running of the championships
  - to publish entry information on the BSBASA website once entries have closed
  - to publish results at the championships venue and on the BSBASA website
  - to publish results on a mobile application
  - to compile the County Records and Meet Best Times
  - within the BSBASA handbook
  - for submitting the results to Swim England Rankings
  - to send results to competing clubs (for their swimmers only)

By entering the championships, entrants are consenting for their data (and that of the swimmers) to be used as above, and are accepting and agreeing to abide by these conditions.

### **Other matters**

94. It is a requirement of entry that all swimmers abide by World Aquatics competition regulation Part 1 Rule 7.1 relating to the good moral taste and suitability of swimwear during the competition, including the warm-up. Swimmers who do not comply will be asked to leave the pool area for the remainder of that session.

### Order of Events – Weekend 2
