MASTERS' COMMITTEE

County events 2007-08

County Long Course Championships (High Wycombe)

This event (planned for 19 January 2008) was cancelled for the second year running as there was nobody to organize it. Thought should be given to making this an event with electronic timing. It would therefore be entered in to the ASA rankings and Decathlon events. It could also be made an open event (rather than by invitation) and would therefore attract more swimmers. Finally, the meet programme could benefit from a different order; putting the 800m in the middle (i.e. 400m, 800m 200m, or 200m, 800m, 400m). In a short meet its highly unlikely one would swim do the 800m and another event, whereas the 200 and 400m are entirely possible.

County Short Course Closed Championships (Eton)

This event, originally planned for 6 April 2008, was cancelled as there was nobody to organize it until the Masters representative's March appointment. It should also adopt electronic timing in order to be entered in to the ASA rankings and Decathlon events.

County Short Course Open Championships 2007 (Maidenhead)

The event took place on Saturday October 20, 2007. The top club prize was won by Maidenhead ASC. The meet went well, the only hiccup being a clash with the rugby world cup final.

Other events

SER & ASA Inter County Masters Championships (at Maidenhead)

The county won this event for the first time in its history. We were 5th overall out of 29 counties the country. The winners were Warwickshire with 1732.5 points. We had 1388.5 points. Sadly our chances of winning were jeopardised as one club in our county refused to swim - as their club internal gala took precedence.

The meet went well, with our own county officials doing a splendid job (thanks to the Adams family and Sue Green). The only problems encountered were related to the poor electronic timing set-up by the Magnet leisure Centre.

European Championships 2007 (Kranj, Slovenia)

8 swimmers from our county attended these championships.

PUBLIC RELATIONS

Although not one of the formal requirements of the PRO, I report here on the task of Dinner Secretary (DS). This year your President Jean Hulbert wished to hold a 'Barn Dance' as the county's annual dinner event. Her objectives were accepted by the Executive "to attempt to engage with a greater number of the younger element of the county". I had a number of discussions and meetings with Jean to arrange this event. Jean was proactive, booked the group of musicians needed and identified someone to licence a bar. We considered a number of possible suitable venues and reserved the Woodcote Village Hall. Eddie produced the flier and booking form which were published on the website. All the other county presidents were invited to celebrate with us in the usual way. Of those that replied only one president accepted the invitation and booked a ticket for a partner. Jean attempted to promote the event

with special offers to our clubs but to no avail. At the beginning of June we were sadly forced to cancel the 'Barn Dance'.

With the increasing use of the internet for communications Eddie has become the interface for my work as Public Relations Officer and County Workforce Coordinator and assists with much of the work of the Dinner Secretary. At the same time his work for the National Swimming League has not reduced. It is because of this, that with much regret, I have decided not to seek re-election as PRO nor to continue as DS in 2008/9. SWIMMING OFFICIALS

Report not yet to hand

SYNCHRONISED SWIMMING COMMITTEE

Synchronised Swimming continues to flourish in the County, with Reading Royals maintaining its position as one of the top competitive clubs in the country and Bracknell having a sizable membership as a recreational club. With the introduction of LTAD FUNDamentals and Aquafun, both clubs have started taking in swimmers from the age of five upwards, which should lead to an increase in competitors in the lower age groups for future competitions.

The Novice Competitions promoted by Reading Royals in June 2008 were a foretaste of this, with 26 swimmers in the 8-10 years category, of which 16 represented County clubs. The overall numbers in the competitions were well up from last year, with 60 of the 174 swimmers, and 7 of the 14 Teams, representing

clubs in the County. A new trophy, the Reading Royals Shield, was donated to the County for the Novice A Group Figures. Results are shown separately.

The County did not promote a Championships, but took its results from the National Championships held in December. County clubs also competed in the new Multi-Regional Championships, held in October. Bracknell club entered a team in the 19 & under recreational section, and Witney won that section, just beating the Reading Royals team. Results are shown separately.

The County has three athletes in the GB Squad training full time for the 2012 Olympics Team, Katie Skelton, Helen Morris and Jazmine Stansbury, and one athlete in the 2008 Junior Squad, Harriet Roberts (Alex Harris was also selected but unable to take up her place). In the National Development Squad there are three County athletes, Katie Clark, Kristina Holley and Becky King and in the Multi-regional Development Squad one athlete, Tianee Buckley. Katie Clark is to attend a training camp in Canada to prepare for the Junior European Duet competitions in 2009. (All these athletes are from Reading Royals).

Without the dedicated support of many volunteers, the sport would not operate, so to all of them, whatever their role, we record our thanks.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

I am both delighted and embarrassed by this year's Annual Report. I am delighted that so many contributors provided such excellent copy in time for me to prepare the report before I went on holiday. I am, however, embarrassed that I was unable to write my own contribution before that date! I am sorry, therefore, that you have had to wait for my *bons mots*, although I imagine that many of you will have enjoyed a sense of relief that the Secretary's bit was missing ...

Swimming, and sport in general, is going through interesting times. No one can fail to have spotted the increased professionalism in our disciplines. While, for instance, a number of [speed] swimming clubs have employed coaches for a number of years, this may well become a feature in the more successful synchro clubs in the future. There is an increasing trend towards paid employment in sport, anyway. We now enjoy the services of a Regional Director, 2 Regional Development Officers, a Regional Administrator, and County Partnership Swimming Development Officers. Old hands like me remember when volunteers did everything ...

For my part, I welcome the expertise and support that these people have brought to the sport. I have no doubt that the Association, and its clubs, have benefited from the advice and assistance offered by Eli, Natalie, Helen, Karen, Joan and Emily since our last Council Meeting. I thanked them then on your behalf, and have no compunction in doing so again. We should particularly thank Emily, who is moving on from her post as PSDO in Buckinghamshire & Milton Keynes. Emily has been very energetic and enthusiastic in support of swimming. She will be a difficult act to follow, I believe, and sorely missed by our Bucks clubs.

In many ways, it is just as well that we have recourse to these paid resources, because it does seem that the pool of ready volunteers is diminishing. We are lucky that Rosemary and Rob, neither of whom is short of work in the sport, took on the County Championships. Had they not put themselves forward, there may well not have been any championships in 2008. This year we are looking for a Trophies' Manager, a Public Relations Officer, and a Workforce Development Officer, at least: sadly, I have given up looking for discipline managers in diving and water polo. With luck, we will fill these vacancies, but I fear that it will only be as a result of already heavily involved people taking something else on. New blood is required!

Unfortunately, there are those out there who think, "The County will sort this out". They forget that they are the County It is an association of clubs brought together by geography. The clubs are the County – therefore, the members of those clubs are the County. I have had to explain this twice in recent years, to people who have complained about aspects of the County Championships. There is much to be said for the old adage "Many hands make light work". Whilst, for instance, many hands make not make the display work at the Magnet, they might make the events run even more smoothly.

What we can say is that our volunteers allow Berks & South Bucks to punch well above its weight in the regional and national arenas. Roger Prior continues to lead ASA South East Region as Chairman of the Regional Board, while Susan Harrison is Chair of the [national] Audit & Probity Committee. Sue Green looks after the Region's trophies and so on.

The successes of the various County teams and members of County clubs are recounted elsewhere in the report. It is a shame that we cannot seem to secure information or involvement in the County on diving or water polo. In diving this is doubly disappointing, given that Albatross were the first diving-only club in the country to secure Swim21 accreditation and Malcolm Green won one of the Region's awards in 2007.

What else has the County achieved in the past year? The Association has striven to live up its role as a sub-region of ASA South East Region. It has worked on its development plan. You will see from the Minutes of the last Annual Council Meeting that we sought to find out what clubs wanted in terms of volunteers development. Unfortunately, not many clubs actually sent the form back. We held a meeting of club chairmen. One of the actions identified by those attending was a need to audit competition opportunities, to see what gaps could be filled. So clubs were sent a survey form. 2 replied. On a more optimistic note, at the second attempt, we ran the Fund Raising Workshop earlier this year (the first attempt was postponed for lack of support): our workshop was the best attended across the Region! We have given support to a bid by the Region for Big Lottery funding, which, if successful, should lead to the appointment of a sort of PSDO for Berkshire.

One area where it would be marvellous to tell of progress would be in connection with pools. Everyone agrees that more long course facilities are needed nationally, and even more so in the Region. It would be nice to have available long-course facilities in the Association's area. Over recent years, we have heard tell of 50m pools in Bracknell, High Wycombe and Reading. None of them have yet to appear on, or rather, in, the ground ... I remain hopeful that at least one of these rumours will be borne out to contain a grain of truth. Will, however, this be in my lifetime?

On that morbid note, I must recall the sad passing, last December, of Tom Chambers, who was President of the Association in 1977 and 1992 and President of Southern Counties ASA in 1988. The Association was well represented at his funeral.

I should pay tribute to our President, Jean. Given the changes in our administrative calendar, this meeting is just past the middle of her year in office. Jean has been an enthusiast for the County so far, and I am sure that her zeal will not diminish in the remaining 5 months.

Finally may I thank

- your Assistant Secretary, Rosemary, who has taken on even more duties,
- my daughter, Sarah, who so kindly arranged for the printing and despatch of the today's agenda whilst I was away,
- my wife, Sandra, whose burden is great!
