#### **SWIMMING COMMITTEE**

The speed swimming county championships and age group competition were held in February and March at Magnet, Maidenhead, with the 800/1500m events being swum long course in a separate session at Aldershot. Following requests from coaches, the format was changed this year to reduce the overall duration of the event, and a consecutive Saturday and Sunday at Magnet was incorporated into the timetable. The feedback from most people involved was that this had worked well. This format will be repeated in 2012.

The organising team also worked on building a stronger relationship with the management team at Magnet, and this did help the smooth running of the event. The reliability of the electronic timing at Magnet continues to be a problem. The equipment there is now so old that even Omega do not have spare parts, and while the Magnet staff do their best, it is prone to breakdown. Fortunately, this year it was the starting system that failed and we were able to switch to the BWSC start systems fairly seamlessly. The County Association has used part of the surplus from the 2011 championships to invest in further backup equipment which should give our championships more resilience to AOE problems.

This year we had 3,305 swims by 468 swimmer representing 11 clubs. There were 6 new country records, and 54 age group best times. Perhaps the highlight was Adam Barrett from Tilehurst beating Phil Hubble's 100m Butterfly record which has stood since 1983!

## SWIMMING OFFICIALS

It has been a very good year with an impressive number of parents coming forward to be trained as officials. By the start of the county championships, there were over 100 trainees in the county, mostly at Judge level 1 but there were trainees at all levels.

All the clubs have requested training and some have organised several courses. The requests could not be met without the support of all the referees. They have run courses, and they have worked wonders to fit in mentoring for the candidates at galas. At some events, there have been more candidates than mentors. There have been additional challenges as we mentor our first deaf candidates and youth members of our disability swimming clubs.

This year there was the additional challenge of delivering the CPD courses for relicensing of officials. An unexpected advantage of this new programme has been the clear route for returning officials back into the sport. I know we have gained 3 who have had several years away from the sport.

Our efforts have resulted in 15 new JL1 ( a further 7 are awaiting examination), 9 new JL2, 3 new J2S, and we hope our referee trainee will pass in November. In spite of this, as a county we ran out of officials for the number of simultaneous events running the first weekend in July. The move to licensed meets for entry to County championships is expected to lead to more course requests at all levels. The much requested Starter course is being planned for September.

#### SYNCHRONISED SWIMMING COMMITTEE

Synchronised Swimming continues to flourish in the County, with Reading Royals maintaining its position as one of the top competitive (and Swim21) clubs in the country and Bracknell having a sizable membership as a recreational club. Both clubs take in swimmers to FUNdamental courses from the age of five upwards.

The County Novice Competitions are held as part of the Reading Royals Novices Competitions in June. Numbers of entries were similar to 2010, with Reading Royals swimmers taking 12 of the individual medals and 5 of the 6 trophies, Bracknell taking 4 of the individual medals and 1 trophy, and Witney taking 3 of the individual medals.

The County took its 2010 Age Groups results from the National and Multi-Regional National Age Groups Championships held towards the end of the year. The Championship results are taken from the British Championships in April 2011. (Competition results are shown separately.)

The County has two athletes in the GB Senior Squad (training full time for the 2012 Olympics Team), Katie Skelton and Katie Clark, both from Reading Royals. The GB swimmers competed in Bonn in March and came 3rd in the Combinations Team event and 5th in the Technical and Free Team events. At the British Championships, they were placed first in all routines, and at the LEN European Cup Competition, held at Ponds Forge in May, they repeated their placings in Bonn. They will shortly be going to Changhai for the World Championships.

In the GB Junior Squad, Reading Royals has two members, Hannah Green and Rhiannon Williams, and at the recent European Junior Championships in Belgrade

the teams were placed 10th in the Technical and Free Teams and 9th in the Combination Team. Kate Coupar, of Reading Royals, has continued to be Head Coach of this National Squad. Hannah Green, as a result of her outstanding performance at the British Championships, has been selected to receive enhanced coaching at the High Performance Centre, where the GB squad train, and Kate Coupar has just been appointed the Performance and Development Coach for Reading Royals and the area, supported by the ASA, with a view to increasing participation in Synchro in Reading and nearby areas and to providing advanced coaching for talented synchro athletes.

There are also 3 Reading Royals swimmers in the England Talent Development Squad. Jade Hearmon and Natalie Saudan, who were in the squad last year too, have been joined by Lucy Farrell.

As always, we would like to acknowledge and thank the many people who contribute to the success of our County Clubs. Without their dedicated support, the sport would not operate, so to all of them, whatever their role, we record our thanks.

## WATER POLO

## SECRETARY'S REPORT

2010/11 proved to be a very interesting year for swimming in its various guises.

As I predicted in my contribution to last year's annual report, the change of Government, following the general election in May 2010, had a profound impact on the paid structure supporting the sport. In his first budget speech, the Chancellor of the Exchequer announced the withdrawal of the Government funding for the free swimming programme introduced by the previous government. The staffing structure adopted by the national governing body, the ASA, in 2009 was very dependent on that funding. The ASA had to rethink its structure for the future ...

Although the 2009 structure had provided for county-based paid staff, they were directed nationally, from Loughborough. There was no regional input into their work, and, locally, the Association had little contact with them. May be they were actively involved with clubs.

The restructure implemented in the face of the loss of the free swimming monies provided for locally based, and regionally managed, aquatic officers. The regions were invited to subscribe to more aquatic officers than the ASA felt that it could afford itself. ASA South East Region agreed to fund additional aquatic officer support, and asked its sub-regional partners if they would help pay. This Association has agreed

to contribute £3,000 per annum, this year and next, towards the cost of the Aquatic Officers, and the part-time Regional Club Development Officer. You may remember that the Region decided to appoint this latter officer in the face of withdrawal of regional development officers by the ASA in 2009.

This Association, its clubs, and their members now benefit therefore from the support not only of the Regional Director, Keith Sutton, and the Regional Finance & Administration Officer, Joan Massie, but also 2 Aquatic Officers – Julie Bunn, who covers east Berkshire and Surrey, and Lisa Darnell, who looks after Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and West Berkshire – and Helen Mack, the Regional Club Development Officer. Helen will be particularly well known to you because of her invaluable role in supporting clubs working towards Swim21 accreditation or re-accreditation. In my view – and I hope it is one you share – the paid staff provide a resilience for our sport which volunteers alone might struggle to deliver, in this day and age.

Of course, the generosity of the ASA in employing these regionally managed staff was not without a price, aside from the financial contribution previously mentioned. The regions are now expected to deliver significantly against the national targets of the ASA, many of which are set by Sport England, and predicated on the funding the ASA receives from that body. The Region has not, thus far, asked sub-regions specifically to tackle some of the areas where it now has to deliver. However, there is a target, about participation – not in the sport, but in the activity of swimming – which may well prove difficult for the Region to achieve, with or without sub-regional help.

Of course, this Association had a development plan. A revised draft was published at the turn of the year, and posted on the Association's website. Clubs and individuals were asked to submit comments to Helen Mack. As I understand it, Helen was not deluged with responses ... Which is just a little dispiriting for those persons who gave up their time, as the Association's Development Sub-Group, to help Helen shape the plan.

That said, such an outcome should not be a surprise. Although the date fell after the year under review, you will remember that the Association recorded a century of existence on 25 April this year. There were plans to celebrate that milestone with an aquatic event, especially as the date fell on Easter Monday. Little support seemed to be forthcoming from the clubs, however, even though the matter had been first mooted some 2 years previously, so that plan was pulled. A similar suggestion, for a celebratory aquatic event in September this year, has now been abandoned. We may yet mark this significant birthday, albeit belatedly, in a social setting ...

So, what does the Association mean for its assigned clubs and their members? Cynics might observe "very little", save as the promoter of county swimming championships. According to Integra, the ASA's membership database, our clubs have 3,946 members. It is reasonable to assume that few of the 1,578 category 1 members have ever heard of the County Association, let alone know what it does. On the other hand, the 750 Category 3 members will, in the main, have heard of the Association, because those volunteers run the clubs, and many will be officials in the

various disciplines: virtually everyone at this meeting falls in this category. So, what do we do for the 1,618 Category 2 members?

Do the members of assigned clubs, in any category, involved in diving or water polo have any knowledge of the Association? Do they care, if they don't?

Regular readers of these reports will know that I often take the opportunity to ride hobby horses, so you won't have been disappointed, thus far!

On a more positive note, this Association is a major player in terms of the Region. Roger Prior is the Chairman of the Regional Management Board. Gary Shields and I are elected member of the Regional Board, and all 3 of us serve on the Board's Finance Sub-Group. Jean Hulbert (and I – I provide Board liaison) are members of the Region's Synchro Development Group. Eileen Adams has an important role in respect of regional swimming competitions. The Region's list of officials, certainly in respect of swimming and synchro, is peppered with the names of members of Berks and South Bucks clubs.

This Association also has a strong record of "being a nuisance", or providing democratic checks and balances, at the Region's Council Meetings. Although the Region has only been in existence since 2005, the Berks & South Bucks Association is the only body to propose motions for debate at the Region's ACM. Indeed, B&SB members are the only people to have given notice of questions on the Region's Report or accounts – the Region's rules require advance notice. Without those questions or proposals, it could be argued that everything would go through "on the nod".

You will see from the minutes of last year's Council Meeting that the Association proposed 2 motions at the 2010 Regional ACM. If my memory serves me correctly, neither was adopted. However, the subjects raised would not even have been aired without those motions. As it happens, the Region has addressed the thrust of those motions: for instance, in 2010/11 the Region's accounts show a deficit of £84,000, thus demonstrating that it is now investing in the sport!

Before I end, I note that there is no reference elsewhere in the annual report about the performance of the County Team in the Inter-County competition in Sheffield, last Autumn. As it says on the Association's website

"There were some excellent swims with a number of personal best times being achieved. The county gained a total of 13 top six places and there were some excellent relay results. The team finished in 6th position out of 20 teams in Division 1, only to be beaten by Lancashire, Yorkshire, Middlesex, Somerset and Northumberland and Durham. The entire team performed well and everyone played their part to the full. "

This was an outstanding result, Congratulations to the team, and, possibly, more importantly, to Nigel Willis and Liz Waddy who provided leadership to our team. Both are standing sown after the 2011 event. They will be a hard act to follow!

In conclusion, may I pay tribute to Sue Green, who kindly agreed to stay on as President when Nigel Brand had to withdraw. Sue re-introduced the County dinner last October, and I am sure that all who attended felt that it was an excellent occasion. May I also thank Rosemary Large for so ably assisting me through the past year.
