The dedication and enthusiasm with which you all serve our Association, through the representation of your clubs, safeguards the future development and support we can offer to our member clubs and, most importantly, to all our athletes.

SWIMMING COMMITTEE

1. County Championships

Despite the problems of 17 March (see more below), the 2012 championships went well.

Entry numbers were down around 7% on 2011 (3,082 versus 3,305). This was most likely due to the requirement for licensed times in 2012. The only rejected entries were from the 800/1500 free at Aldershot. The requirement for entry times to be achieved at licensed meet went well overall. It did expose a few issues over verification of entered times to ASA Rankings, but these were resolved satisfactorily. We will continue with this requirement but will refine the entry and verification process. This is underway.

We changed the format of finals in 2012 (in response to feedback from the clubs in 2011). B finals were discontinued and replaced by junior finals. This does require some complex rules for determining the junior championship results (to allow for juniors qualifying for the championship final), which we expected might be controversial. However, by and large, these rules were well understood and accepted and the feedback was positive. We will continue with junior finals in 2013.

There were some strong performances and 10 new records were set.

Windsor did particularly well. Lily Glover broke or equalled 4 records and Katherine Ambridge broke 2 (including Sharron Davies' 50m Fly record set in 1989!). Windsor also broke two relay records. There were also 43 new age group best times. A full list is attached as Appendix 1 to the report

The elderly AOE systems at Maidenhead at Aldershot continued to give problems, but the investment in back up equipment made by the County Association meant we were able to cope with these. As usual we held a feedback conference call for coaches. There was support for the overall format of the championships. Some suggestions and improvements were suggested and wherever possible we will be incorporating these into the 2013 championship format.

The dates for the 2013 championships have been published on the BSBASA website and we expect full details to be published by the end of July. Other than the changes

to the entry process (and the checking of entry times to the ASA Ranking database) there will be no major changes.

2. Events of 17 March

Around 4:00pm on 17 March, the drains at Magnet began to overflow, initially flooding reception. As the centre staff tried to remedy the problem, part of changing rooms became contaminated with untreated sewage. The centre manager then deployed the fire alarm and the whole pool and spectator area were evacuated. Some 20 minutes later, swimmers and spectators were allowed access the spectator area, but at that point it was clear that the contamination of the changing area had become so widespread that further competition was not possible and the rest of the day's swimming was abandoned. This left the 50m breaststroke finals from session 8 and all the relays from session 9 unswum.

During 19 March, it became clear that a number of the clubs were keen to see the missed events swum and also that the already congested swimming calendar required that this be done by 1 April. There followed some rapid action by the Championship team, followed by an emergency phone meeting of the swimming committee on the evening of 19 March. At that meeting, it was decided that we could put on the missed events on the evening of Sunday 25 March, and that we would do so if 6 out of the 11 clubs would attend.

4 of the clubs already had other commitments and could not attend but 7 did commit to attend. In the end something like 80% of the finalists and teams did participate, and there was a very full spectator gallery. The feedback was very positive and the speed with which the swimming committee were able to act received universal praise. My thanks go to Stuart Fillingham who did a lot of the work while I was abroad and also to Windsor SC who gave up their session on the Sunday evening. We have negotiated a £970 reduction of the hire cost with Magnet in the light of these problems, which I think is a fair outcome.

3. County team coach and manager

Both Nigel Willis and Liz Waddy "retired" from the county coach and team manager roles respectively after the 2011 intercounties. The Association has appointed Matt Heathcock and Joan Scarrott as their successors, and they have both taken on their new roles with enthusiasm. In particular, they are developing a series of county training events, and we hope to put in the first of these latter in 2012.

4. No Frills and proposed development meet

Following a poor entry in 2011 and weak support from the county clubs, No Frills was not held in 2012. Whilst the position will be kept under review, the general lack of demand for Level 1 (and to some extent level 2) meets mean that it is unlikely that No Frills will be revived in the future. My personal view is that the pools available to the Association (and our member clubs) to hold open meets are some way below the standard of the new pools that have become available outside the county and until such time as we have something closer to a state of the art facility, we and our member clubs will struggle to hold successful Level 1 and 2 meets.

The swimming committee are looking to hold a development meet in place of No Frills. A crowded competition calendar and limited pool availability are proving a significant barrier, but we have a provisional date of 14 October, and we are currently exploring pool availability.

5. 2011 Intercounties

Nigel Willis, the County Team Coach reports:

“Twenty four swimmers from Berks & South Bucks together with County President Sue Green, Team Manager Liz Waddy and coaches Matt Heathcock and Nigel Willis travelled to Sheffield for the National Inter County Team Championships.

“The Ponds Forge pool is split into two 25 metre pools for the event with 38 county teams from across Great Britain competing. Teams from Division 1 competed in one pool with teams from Division 2 in the other. The starts are staggered resulting in two races going on at the same time. The atmosphere during the competition was great and the swimmers from all the county teams were getting into the spirit by dressing up and painting themselves in the team colours.

“There were some excellent swims and a large number of personal best times were recorded. Oliver Leonard achieved 1st place in the boys 16/17 100 freestyle and 2nd in the 100 fly and Lucy Campbell took 3rd in the 14/15 100 freestyle. Coupled with some excellent relay results and many top ten finishes the team finished 12th overall in Division 1, with only 25 points separating Cheshire in 7th Place and Berks & South Bucks in 12th Place. The entire team performed well and were a credit to the county.

“Well done all swimmers.”

6. Swimming committee

The swimming committee has only existed in an informal form during recent years. In 2011/12, it was reintroduced as a more formal body, with clear terms of reference. I am grateful to Helen Whittle, Stuart Fillingham, Jonathan Mills and Gary Shields who agreed to stand and were elected to the committee, together with Sue Green (an ex-officio member) each of whom has made a strong contribution during the year

SWIMMING OFFICIALS

Report not yet to hand

SYNCHRONISED SWIMMING COMMITTEE

Synchronised Swimming continues to flourish in the County, with Reading Royals maintaining its position as one of the top competitive (and Swim21) clubs in the country and Bracknell having a sizable membership as a recreational club. Both clubs take in swimmers to FUNdamental courses from the age of five upwards.

The County Novice Competitions are held as part of the Reading Royals Novices Competitions in June. Numbers of entries were slightly down on last year (63 entries for figures compared to 70, and 5 instead of 6 teams). Reading Royals swimmers won 7 of the individual medals, Bracknell 9 of the individual medals and 2 trophies, and Witney taking 5 of the individual medals and 1 trophy, while Reading won two of the Team trophies and Witney the third.

The County took its 2011 Age Groups results from the National Age Groups Championships held in December. The Championship results are taken from the British Championships in April 2012. (Competition results are shown separately in Appendix 3.) Special mention must be made of Rhiannon Williams, who won the British Championships Senior and Junior Technical and Free solos and Senior and Junior Duet titles with her partner Sophie Usher; these successes, together with the results of Reading Royals teams, of which she was a member, won her the Holland trophy for best performing swimmer in the Championships.

There is great excitement as the Olympics approach as there are two Reading Royals swimmers in the GB Synchro team, Katie Skelton (who has been in the squad since its inception) and Katie Clark (who was selected more recently). Hannah Green was selected this year to join the squad, but is not competing this time. The GB squad has been gradually climbing up the rankings internationally over the past 4 years that a full-time squad has been training, and we wish them every possible success in the London Games.

As always, we would like to acknowledge and thank the many people who contribute to the success of our County Clubs. Without their dedicated support, the sport would not operate, so to all of them, whatever their role, we record our thanks.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

I often take advantage of this opportunity to wax lyrical, mount hobby horses and, indeed, display a degree of scepticism and cynicism about the national governing body. I will try to restraint myself this year ... Only you will know whether I succeed.

May I first pay tribute to Sue Green, whose year in the office of President turned into 2 years. I am sure that you will all join me in thanking Sue for “carrying on”, so to speak. Her knack of securing the services of a range of past presidents to make presentations, by rotation, was a joy to behold, and a nightmare for the announcer who did not know which venerable person would actually be handing out the medals! Seriously, Sue’s willingness to continue in office – even September 2011 became December 2011 in the end – spared the Association’s blushes.

By the same token, I am glad that Nigel Brand has now been able to take up the reins, and, what is more, for the first time in my memory, the Association even has the luxury of the succession being sorted out going forward. I hope Council will adopt the new constitution which allows for the formalising for a role for Vice President or President Elect.

Sadly we bade adieu to another past president in the year under review. Ed Bowditch was president in 1987, and was Hon Secretary from 1983 to 1987. I had the honour to succeed Ed into the role of Secretary, at his encouragement. I have to say, I found him a hard act to follow, because of his enthusiasm, energy and capacity for involvement in all aspects of the sport. Older members of assigned clubs and seasoned officials will remember Ed for his role in the national officials’ examinations. He lent me a pair of white trousers once, at a gala when I had forgotten mine ...I must have been much slimmer then, because they fitted me!

One of my ongoing greatest pleasures in the sport has been acting as a poolside official. In that role, something new happens every year. Until 2012, I had never been evacuated from the premises at a gala, a point I, as it transpired, foolishly gave voice to, when, as referee, I briefed the officials before the afternoon session of the County Championships on 17 March. You will have already read, elsewhere, what happened that day!

It is a tribute to the meet management and my fellow officials that afternoon that the evacuation went as smoothly as possible, and the return to the premises was well ordered. In addition, Rob Moore and Stuart Fillingham, together with the other members of the Swimming Committee, quickly formulated a recovery plan which led to the completion of the championships series. The Association, its clubs and their members owe a big debt of gratitude to Rob and Stuart. We must also thank Windsor SC for giving up their pool time on the following Sunday.

The brochure, to mark the centenary of the Association, was published at the County Championships. We must thank John Rowley for that excellent publication. Copies were supplied to all clubs, and I am sure that, if you would like a copy, one could be found.

As a sport, it is axiomatic that swimming is dynamic – movement is paramount. Whether one would use that adjective to describe the ASA is a matter of your choice. However, no one can accuse them of a lack of movement, especially the national governing body’s employees.

I wrote last year about how the ASA had decided that its aquatic officers would be based out in the regions and directed regionally. Well, you may not be surprised that

that model was somewhat short-lived. Under plans unveiled towards the end of 2011, all the formerly regionally managed staff are now managed centrally, from Loughborough. The Regional Director, for instance, is no longer accountable to the Regional Management Board but to a manager at headquarters. The staff are already Loughborough-facing, but, although they continue to be based across the regions (and around the region in the case of the South East), there is no clarity yet about their local roles.

It was clear at last year's ASA Council that the ASA top management, and the ASA Management Board, recognised that they were losing touch with the clubs and their members – who are, of course, the ASA's members. There was much talk about a renewed focus on the sport rather than the mantra of the past few years – participation. Incidentally, participation did not necessarily mean people joining clubs and being involved in the sport, but bodies in the water for social, health or recreational purposes. So the ASA intends to improve "its offer to clubs". However, the last I heard was that that was a little intangible thus far...

Nevertheless, the Association, along with the other sub-regional bodies in the South East, has supported financially the creation and retention of the Region's Club Development Officer, an invaluable asset to the Region, and who is not part of the ASA cadre of employees. The RCDO is, I believe, a great ally for clubs, particularly when they are striving for Swim 21 status, or seeking re-accreditation.

This gives me the opportunity to thank, on your behalf, Keith Sutton, the Regional Director (and, I think, a member of one of the Association's assigned clubs), Bryony Gibbs who succeeded Joan Massie in masterminding the Region's office at Bisham Abbey (in our area), the aquatic officers who cover our area, especially Julie Bunn, who kindly comes to the meetings of the Executive Committee, and Helen Mack, the RCDO. I sometimes think that Julie gets a raw deal at the Executive Committee – sitting through much probably less than exciting business, until her spot on the agenda, when she can report, just as the President lowers the 10 o'clock guillotine!

The Association is well represented amongst the ranks of the volunteers with regional (and national) profiles. Roger Prior is Chairman of the Regional Management Board. Gary Shields and I are members of that Board, too, and members of its finance sub-group – the people who recommend by how much the regional affiliation fees should go up: nil, at it happens, for 2013! Jean Hulbert is a member of the Regional Development Group and the Region's Synchro Development Group. Eileen Adams has a significant role with Regional swimming events. It is, maybe, invidious just to mention them, because I could, and should, go on.

I shall not, however, go on about what the Association means to "its" clubs and their members, because I have thrashed that to within inches of its life in recent years. It is, perhaps, only in moments of crisis, like the sh1t gate earlier this year, when any thought is given to it. I suppose the same fate befalls the ASA, but the difference is we and you all pay directly to be members of the ASA, while we get into this Association for free! Both organisations are, nevertheless, basically founded in democracy – it's just that people forget that it is *their* county association and *their* ASA.

On that note, I hope that clubs and their members will support the proposed county training day.

Before signing off, it would be remiss me of me not to mention the imminent Olympic Games. A number of members of the Association's clubs will be performing at the Aquatic Centre. Mention has been made elsewhere about Katie Skelton and Katie Clark. The Executive Committee, earlier this year, congratulated Simon Burnett and Andrew Willis on their selection for the GB swimming team. They will be in the water. Susan Harrison and Helen Whittle will, we hope, not fall into the water whilst officiating! Let's wish them all every success and an enjoyable Games.

I have every reason to believe that GB will do well, which is just as well, because I suspect that success will be important for securing future funding for the sport.

In conclusion, may I thank Rosemary Large for so ably assisting me through the past year, as always, especially at the meetings when I was double booked, and Sandra, my wife, who has to put up with a lot!
